was discovered seeping into Newtown Creek. In the almost 30 years since that discovery, Exxon has barely recovered half of the oil, has made no progress in identifying the extent of the dissolved groundwater plume or treating the contaminated soil, and has not addressed the contamination in Newtown Creek.

The suit seeks the termination of oil spills into the creek; scientific testing and investigations to determine the full scope of the environmental contamination in the area; increased recovery of underground oil; cleanup of contaminated groundwater and soil; restoration of Newtown Creek; damages for the injuries to the affected natural resources, and substantial financial penalties.

On Feb. 8, 2007, Cuomo's office filed a Notice of Intent to Sue ExxonMobil for violations of the federal Clean Water Act and the federal Resource Conservation and Recovery Act. Subsequently, ExxonMobil unilaterally shut off its oil discharge pumping system, effectively terminating ongoing efforts to treat and remove oil from the site of the spill. At the direction of the state, ExxonMobil applied for a new State Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (SPDES) permit.

The application is being reviewed by the DEC. In the interim, the DEC provided temporary authorization that included stricter discharge limitations, a required evaluation of interim technical measures to further limit contaminant discharges,

and increased reporting requirements. ExxonMobil resumed pumping on June 28.

New York state is suing ExxonMobil under the federal Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, the federal Clean Water Act, the federal Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA, also known as Superfund), the federal Oil Pollution Act, the state's Navigation Law and the state's Environmental Conservation Law. The state is also asserting claims of public nuisance and common law indemnification and restitution in the litigation.

Since 2002, Gioia has been leading the fight to clean up Newtown Creek. In 2004, Riverkeeper, Gioia, Councilmember David Yassky and Brooklyn Borough President Marty Markowitz initiated a federal case against ExxonMobil and began collaborating with the Office of the Attorney General. Attorney General Cuomo's filing represents a dramatic turning point in the progress of this landmark case.

Also hailing Cuomo's efforts at getting ExxonMobil to clean up Newtown Creek was state Senator George Onorato, most of whose 12th senate district includes Long Island City. "I applaud Attorney General Cuomo's commitment to the environment and to the health and well-being of the residents of Greenpoint and my constituents in Western Queens, whose neighborhoods border the shores of Newtown Creek," Onorato said in a statement printed in full elsewhere in this issue. "Newtown Creek is one of the nation's most polluted waterways, and the massive 17-million-gallon underground oil spill that has contaminated it so severely throughout the years is thought to be the largest in United States history. I'm delighted that [Cuomo] is moving to hold ExxonMobil's feet to the fire and to compel it to take real responsibility for the environmental disaster it has been so instrumental in creating."

ExxonMobil Refining and Supply Company is a subsidiary of ExxonMobil Corporation that operates the company's facilities. The suit was filed in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of New York. Federal District Judge Carol B. Amon has been assigned to hear the case.

The case is being handled by Katherine Kennedy, Special Deputy Attorney General for Environmental Protection and Gordon J. Johnson, Deputy Bureau Chief of the Environmental Protection Bureau, and with the assistance of Environmental Scientist Jodi Feld.
